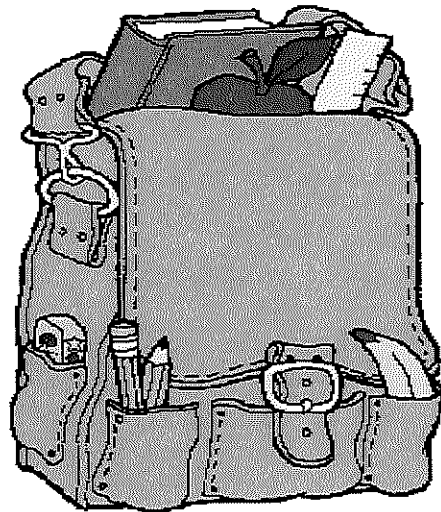

Tuition: Tuition is due on the 1st of each month. Unless arrangements are made with the school office, a \$50.00 late fee is assessed after the 7th of each month. The school policy on late tuition payments will be strictly enforced.

Payment Options: All payment options will be through **FACTS Management Company**. Within the Re-enroll/Enrollment process you will also set up your FACTS account.

School Time: **Thursday, August 16, 2018 is the first day of school.**
Pre-K3 – 8th Grade classes will begin at 7:55 A.M. & end at 3:15 P.M. Doors open at 7:00 A.M. for Morning Care. Children not enrolled in After School Care, but remaining on the school grounds after 3:30 P.M., will be sent to the After School Care Program and a fee will be assessed.

Uniform: Please see Dress Code – General Provisions page (attached).

School Supplies: Supply list attached. Label everything, including clothes with child's name & grade.

Orientation: Parent Orientation Night: the purpose of these meetings is to share expectations, curriculum, overviews, school-wide/classroom rules, school policies, etc.

Parent Orientation Night will be held on Tuesday, August 14, 2018 @ 6:00 p.m.

Registration/Purchase: School Store will be open the week of August 6, 2018 to August 9, 2018. The schedule is as follows:

For parents wishing to purchase Lunch Tickets, STM PE T-shirts, shorts, spirit shirts and sweatshirts, or to register for After School Care, or Extra Curricular Activities, tables will be set up in Carolan Hall from 7:00 to 8:30 A.M. on Thursday, August 16, 2018.

After School Care: Registration fee is \$40.00 per family. Hours are from 3:25 – 6:00 P.M.

Daily rates are \$14.00/per day (per child).

Morning Care: 7:00 – 7:45 A.M. (in school Cafeteria). Parents must accompany students on the first day (no charge for morning care).

Dress Code – General Provisions 2018-2019

DRESS UNIFORM IS MANDATORY FOR ALL STUDENTS Pre-K3 - 8TH GRADES.

Pre-K3 - 8th Grades STM Logo Cardigan or Windbreaker (Mandatory, one or the other)

Uniform Suppliers:

Uniform Plus – Uniform items can be purchased here, except school store items.
School Store- Ties, PE uniform, Spirit Shirts, ALL outer wear
Shoes Unlimited – All shoes Pre-K3 - 8th Grades may be purchased here.

Uniform Classifications:

Dress Uniform – worn on Friday or when requested
Casual Uniform –worn on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, or when requested
Spirit Dress Uniform-worn on Wednesday or when requested
PE Uniform-worn daily (Pre-K3 & Pre-K4 and Kinder on request)
Dress Up Days-worn on special days
Free Dress Days-worn on special days

STM Logo must be embroidered on girls and boys ties & polo shirts, girl's middy blouse, PreK3 - Kinder Middy dress & all outer wear.

Uniform Skirts: MUST have pleats all the way around the skirt. All elementary grade skirts must be GREEN plaid, purchased from Uniform Plus. Middle school wear navy blue pleated skirts. All skirts must touch the top of the knee cap in the front and back of the knee.

Uniform Pants or Shorts: may not have side pockets (NO Cargo style), No over-sized legs, and **NO CAPRIS.**

Belts: A belt must be worn with all boys' pants and shorts that have belt loops. Black belts for the elementary and brown belts for the middle school. 8th Grade Boys wear a Black belt. Girls must wear black belts if they choose to wear their polo shirt tucked in or with Spirit shirt. Plain belt buckles only.

Shoes: Pre-K3 & 4 and Kinder MUST wear ALL WHITE Velcro leather shoes.

Girl's 1st-5th Grades must wear white and blue OXFORDS (Purchased at Shoes Unlimited)

Boy's 1st – 5th Grades and ALL 6th and 7th Graders MUST wear ALL WHITE leather tennis shoes. ALL shoes must have laces or Velcro.

8th Grade Girls wear black penny loafers and boys wear black oxford shoes Monday-Friday.

8th Grade tennis shoes for PE must be ALL white leather.

NO color trim, sparkles, glitter, slip-ons or high tops may be worn.

Socks: ALL WHITE CREW SOCKS are worn by all students Pre-K3 - 8th Grade.

Girls Pre-K3 - 8th Grade **MUST wear KNEE HIGH socks** with Dress Uniform.

Undershirts: ALL WHITE, NO PRINT short sleeve undershirts or camisoles may be worn and tucked in pants, shorts, or skirts. Girl's t-shirt must not be visible above the top of their blouse.

Outer Wear: ALL students must own either an STM Logo Cardigan or Windbreaker.

Other STM Logo apparel: Sweatshirt, V neck sweater & vest may be worn with **DRESS, CASUAL AND SPIRIT** Uniforms. **ALL OUTER WEAR** are purchased at our School Store.

Cold Weather: Only STM Logo apparel may be worn in the classroom. This includes STM sweatshirt, (purchased @ STM School Store), STM Cardigan (purchased @ Uniform Plus) and STM jackets (purchased @ School Store). All other jackets and sweatshirts must be taken off during morning care. Jackets and sweatshirts with inappropriate symbols, sayings, language, pictures, or rock group/gang symbology may not be worn.

Free Dress: Free Dress Days are dress-up days, not dress-down days. Items worn for Free Dress Days must be appropriate for Catholic School with a student population that ranges from Pre-K3 - 8th Grades.

For Free Dress Days, the following is not permitted:

- Low cut, skinny, low rise, or over-sized pants, slacks, or **JEANS**.
- Short-shorts (must be to your fingertips by your side).
- Short skirts (must be at your knee front and back).
- Low cut tops of any kind, tank top, spaghetti strap tops, see-through tops, short tops (no midriffs exposed).
- **NO Open toed shoes** (to include flip-flops and sandals), **NO** high heels.
- "T" shirts or any other kind of shirt, jacket, and sweatshirt with inappropriate symbols, sayings language, pictures, or rock group/gang symbology.
- Leggings may only be worn with a skirt or dress that is fingertip length.
- **NO** basketball shorts.
- **NO** wind pants or sweatpants.

2018 - 2019 Texas Minimum State Vaccine Requirements for Students Grades K - 12

This chart summarizes the vaccine requirements incorporated in the Texas Administrative Code (TAC), Title 25 Health Services, §§97.61-97.72. This document is not intended as a substitute for the TAC, which has other provisions and details. The Department of State Health Services (DSHS) is granted authority to set immunization requirements by the Texas Education Code, Chapter 38.

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

A student shall show acceptable evidence of vaccination prior to entry, attendance, or transfer to a child-care facility or public or private elementary or secondary school in Texas.

For 8th – 12th grade : 1 dose of Tdap is required when 10 years have passed since the last dose of tetanus-containing vaccine. Td is acceptable in place of Tdap if a medical contraindication to pertussis exists.
Polio ¹							4 doses or 3 doses							For K – 12th grade : 4 doses of polio; 1 dose must be received on or after the 4 th birthday. However, 3 doses meet the requirement if the 3 rd dose was received on or after the 4 th birthday.
Measles, Mumps, and Rubella ^{1,2} (MMR)							2 doses							For K – 12th grade : 2 doses are required, with the 1 st dose received on or after the 1 st birthday. Students vaccinated prior to 2009 with 2 doses of measles and one dose each of rubella and mumps satisfy this requirement.
Hepatitis B ²							3 doses							For students aged 11 – 15 years, 2 doses meet the requirement if adult hepatitis B vaccine (Recombivax [®]) was received. Dosage (10 mcg /1.0 mL) and type of vaccine (Recombivax [®]) must be clearly documented. If Recombivax [®] was not the vaccine received, a 3-dose series is required.
Varicella ^{1,2,3}							2 doses							The 1 st dose of varicella must be received on or after the 1 st birthday. For K – 12th grade : 2 doses are required.
Meningococcal ¹ (MCV4)							1 dose							For 7th – 12th grade , 1 dose of quadrivalent meningococcal conjugate vaccine is required on or after the student's 11 th birthday. Note : If a student received the vaccine at 10 years of age, this will satisfy the requirement.
Hepatitis A ^{1,2}							2 doses							The 1st dose of hepatitis A must be received on or after the 1 st birthday. For K – 9th grade : 2 doses are required.

¹ Receipt of the dose up to (and including) 4 days before the birthday will satisfy the school entry immunization requirement.

² Serologic evidence of infection or serologic confirmation of immunity to measles, mumps, rubella, hepatitis B, hepatitis A, or varicella is acceptable in place of vaccine.

³ Previous illness may be documented with a written statement from a physician, school nurse, or the child's parent or guardian containing wording such as: "This is to verify that (name of student) had varicella disease (chickenpox) on or about (date) and does not need varicella vaccine." This written statement will be acceptable in place of any and all varicella vaccine doses required.

Exemptions

Texas law allows (a) physicians to write medical exemption statements that the vaccine(s) required would be medically harmful or injurious to the health and well-being of the child or household member, and (b) parents/guardians to choose an exemption from immunization requirements for reasons of conscience, including a religious belief. The law does not allow parents/guardians to elect an exemption simply because of inconvenience (for example, a record is lost or incomplete and it is too much trouble to go to a physician or clinic to correct the problem). Schools should maintain an up-to-date list of students with exemptions, so they may be excluded in times of emergency or epidemic declared by the commissioner of public health.

Instructions for requesting the official exemption affidavit that must be signed by parents/guardians choosing the exemption for reasons of conscience, including a religious belief, can be found at www.ImmunizeTexas.com under "School & Child-Care." The original Exemption Affidavit must be completed and submitted to the school.

For children claiming medical exemptions, a written statement by the physician must be submitted to the school. Unless it is written in the statement that a lifelong condition exists, the exemption statement is valid for only one year from the date signed by the physician.

Provisional Enrollment

All immunizations should be completed by the first date of attendance. The law requires that students be fully vaccinated against the specified diseases. A student may be enrolled provisionally if the student has an immunization record that indicates the student has received at least one dose of each specified age-appropriate vaccine required by this rule. To remain enrolled, the student must complete the required subsequent doses in each vaccine series on schedule and as rapidly as is medically feasible and provide acceptable evidence of vaccination to the school. A school nurse or school administrator shall review the immunization status of a provisionally enrolled student every 30 days to ensure continued compliance in completing the required doses of vaccination. If, at the end of the 30-day period, a student has not received a subsequent dose of vaccine, the student is not in compliance and the school shall exclude the student from school attendance until the required dose is administered.

Additional guidelines for provisional enrollment of students transferring from one Texas public or private school to another, students who are dependents of active duty military, students in foster care, and students who are homeless can be found in the TAC, Title 25 Health Services, Sections 97.66 and 97.69.

Documentation

Since many types of personal immunization records are in use, any document will be acceptable provided a physician or public health personnel has validated it. The month, day, and year that the vaccination was received must be recorded on all school immunization records created or updated after September 1, 1991.
